How to grow potatoes at home Prepare the soil by digging and removing weeds, and then dig straight trenches 12cm deep and 60cm apart. Plant seed potatoes 30cm apart and cover them with soil to fill the trench. When the shoots reach 20cm tall, use a rake, hoe or spade to mound soil up around the bases of the shoots, covering the stems half way.

The traditional planting method is to dig a narrow trench 12cm (5in) deep. The seed tubers are spaced 30cm (12in) apart for earlies and 37cm (15in) for maincrop varieties in rows 24in (60cm) apart for earlies and 75cm (30in) apart for maincrop. However, if you want to do things the old-fashioned way, then growing in the ground will always give you a good crop. Dig a trench in your garden to make a bed. Move the soil to form a channel that ' s 6-inches wide and 8-inches deep, and taper the bottom to around 3-inches in width. Grow your potatoes in rows, and space them at 3-feet apart.

Place your potato pot in a sunny, frost-free spot. Add 10cm of peat-free, multi-purpose compost to the bottom of the pot and place three to five chitted seed potatoes a hand with apart, on the surface. Cover with 8-10cm of compost and water well. How to plant potatoes Planting times vary considerably depending on soil conditions, and regional weather variations, but the table below should give you a general idea. Dig a trench to a depth of about 10 cm (4") and place the seed potatoes into the soil with the rose end pointing up.

Plant seed potatoes into dug trenches or individual planting holes. Plant your tubers around six inches (15cm) deep, and space them a foot (30cm) apart along the row. Additional rows of early varieties should be spaced at least 18 inches (45cm) apart, while maincrops need a minimum of 30 inches (75cm) left between rows.

Two weeks before your set planting date, lay out your seed potatoes somewhere that gets plenty of light, and that ' s between 60 and 70 ° F (15.5 and 21 ° C).

As the shoots grow continue to add further layers of potting medium until you reach within a whisker of the rim of the container. Remember to water and feed once or twice with your liquid feed.

How to Successfully Grow Potatoes in Containers

Here ' s how to plant your potato bags: •Fill an 8 litre potato bag with quality multipurpose compost to about 2.5cm (1") below the rim. •Carefully plunge a single chitted potato tuber into the compost with the shoots pointing upwards, to a depth of 12cm (5") from the soil surface. Gently cover the tuber with compost.
