How parental substance misuse affects children: key points ...

Most parents or carers who drink alcohol or use drugs do it in moderation and are not a risk to their children. But if their drinking or drug use becomes harmful, this is substance misuse and it can stop them from providing safe care for their children.

Iriss defines parental substance misuse as "a situation where a parent uses illegal or prescription drugs or alcohol to the extent where their judgement or behaviour is impaired and results in a detrimental effect on the children in the family" 4. Parental substance misuse is frequently characterised in research as an 'adverse childhood experience'.

Parental substance misuse and social worker intervention ...

Not all children whose parents misuse alcohol or drugs are at risk of harm, but parents who drink or use substances can find it particularly challenging to take care of their children. When a parent engages in prolonged and untreated drug abuse, their children are invariably the primary casualties. Children of drug-addicted parents are robbed of the love, support, stability, and sense of home to which every child has a right. This is in addition to vulnerability to the immediate physical health risks of prenatal drug use.

Drug-Addicted Parents - The Effects on Children from ...

Some parents with drug or alcohol problems tried to maintain a normal home atmosphere and some of the children reported that their parents clearly did their best to look after them. Parents often went to some lengths to hide substance misuse, especially drug misuse, from children and many of the sample spoke of how they had found out about the abuse for themselves.

Effects of parents' drug use on young children. Using drugs does not mean that an adult cannot be a caring and responsible parent (Potts, 2005). However, where there is problem drug use, often combined with mental health problems and poverty, children are at increased risk of: neglect and abuse; dangerously inadequate supervision

Children of alcohol- or drug-addicted parents may use the drugs their parents inadvertently make available to them to offset the emotional trauma, including anxiety and depression, resulting from parental abuse of drugs and alcohol in the home. The Impact Of Parental Drug And Alcohol Abuse On Children

In addition to this, children of parents with substance abuse problems may be at a higher risk of developing a drug or alcohol addiction, depression, anxiety, antisocial or suicidal behaviors.

Single Parents and Substance Abuse

Children whose parents misuse drugs and alcohol may benefit from further help (e.g. pastoral support, counselling or community support). Develop good relationships with parents, seizing every opportunity to help them help their child. Explore strengths and assets in the family rather than just focusing on problems.

Parental substance misuse : Mentally Healthy Schools

Drugs: 11 Five had fathers who were drug misusers, of whom three used heroin and two cannabis. Three had mothers who were drug misusers, of whom one used heroin and amphetamines, one used dihydrocodeine and one used cannabis. Two had both parents who were drug misusers, all heroin users. One had a heroin-using brother in a parental role.
