The gallows were portable and were set up at the gaol (jail) when needed. These gallows were first used in 1813 to hang two burglars. The New Drop design was not very effective as the drop was too short to break the neck cleanly. Portable. If a crime took place inside, gallows were sometimes erected—and the criminal hanged—at the front door.

A gallows was set up in the West wing of the main prison building (see "Westflügel" on the map). This wing was kept separate from the rest of the prison. The gallows was modelled on the design of the one at Pentonville prison in London which had trap doors wide enough to permit double (side by side) hangings which were the norm here. Prisoners were permitted the services of a minister of their religion prior to execution.

The construction of Holloway Prison, to the designs of James Bunstone Bunning, began in 1849 and was completed in 1852 to form the City of London House of Correction, opening in October 1852. As built, it had three wings for males and one for females and juveniles. It was the main prison for the City of London and had cost £91,547 10s 8d. There were 436 cells, 283 for males, 60 for females, 62 for juveniles, 18 refractory cells, 14 reception cells and 14 workrooms.
